## **SCHEDULE**

**Class 1 Co-operative Competition. Entry Fee: £2.50. One entry per WI.**

**Theme: "A Welsh Myth or Legend". WALES FEDERATION ROSE BOWL.**

The combined exhibit shall consist of 5 items to depict the theme (wine may not be included) A free standing exhibit on ANY SHAPE BASE and staged within a maximum space of 30" x 30" and to be viewed from the front only (take care with neatness of sides and back).

Produce:                    One item of preserved food/foods  
                                  One cooked item (must not contain meat or fish)

Craft:                        Two items showing a variety of skills

Floral Art:                 One exhibit

Marks to be awarded as follows:

Each item 20 marks	100 marks	
Staging and Display	20 marks	
Interpretation	20 marks	Total 140 marks

Judging will be in accordance with NFWI handbook "On with the Show". Exhibit wording may be in Welsh or English or any combination of the two. No more than three members will be allowed to stage at any one time. The Federation will make a grant of £100 to assist with travel etc to the Royal Welsh Show in July.

## **2024 NFWI-WALES FLOWER ARRANGEMENT CLASS** **POWYS-BRECKNOCK FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S INSTITUTES PERPETUAL TROPHY**

**Thema\Theme: A Welsh Myth or Legend.**

Open to all Federations of Women's Institutes - one entry per federation  
Exhibit to be staged on a trestle table. Space allowed - 2'6" (76cm) wide by 2ft 3" (68cm) deep.  
Height unlimited – no additional backing allowed.

Exhibits must be arranged at the show within the space allocated. Name of competitor and Federation to be displayed.

A maximum spend of **£50 on flowers** is allowed (not including foliage) and members will be required to provide a receipt at the event.

The exhibit will be judged in accordance with the current edition of "Schedule of Definitions" NAFAS Competition Manual.

## **INDIVIDUAL CLASSES Entry Fee 50p (one entry per member)**

### **COOKERY (please display on a hard plate or as appropriate)**

- Class 2 4 Savoury Muffins
- Class 3 Meringue Roulade
- Class 4 A small jar of Lemon Curd
- Class 5 4 Chelsea Buns
- Class 6 Rhubarb Tart. Pastry top and bottom. Not exceeding 8" (20cms) in diameter.
- Class 7 Round fat-free Chocolate Sponge using whisk method. Not exceeding 7" (17.8cms) in diameter.

### **FLORAL ART**

- Class 8 4" x 4" (11 x 11cm) exhibit, height in proportion, incorporating a small jug.
- Class 9 9" x 9" (23 x 23cm) A posy of flowers suitable for a birthday gift.
- Class 10 12" x 12" (31.5 x 31.5cm) height in proportion, exhibit for the 2024 Olympic Games  
No florist foam.
- Class 11 15" x 15" (39 x 39cm) height in proportion, exhibit incorporating a photo frame.
- Class 12 18" x 18" (45.7 x 45.7cm) height in proportion, exhibit depicting a film.
- Class 13 **Geoff Thomas Cup:** Pot of mixed planted herbs no larger than 12" (31.5cm) square.

### **CRAFT**

- Class 14 Knitted Hot Water Bottle Cover.
- Class 15 Glasses /spectacle case, any medium.
- Class 16 Mini Amigurumi crocheted creature, maximum size 6" (15.2cm). (Japanese crochet)
- Class 17 Decorative Item incorporating buttons (not clothing).
- Class 18 Hand Painted Greeting Card A5 size with envelope.
- Class 19 Black & White Photograph of a local window (please provide location).

### **CHILDREN'S CLASSES (outside of points)**

- Class 20 3 Cornflakes Cakes – age group 10 and under.
- Class 21 3 Jam Tarts – age group 11 and over.

# RULES

- 1 Entries **must be the work** of paid-up members of CFWI and are limited to **one entry per member per class**. Dual Members can compete for either their primary or second WI.
- 2 All work on individual entries must be entirely carried out by the member entering and must be **new and unused**, but the article may be washed.
- 3 No trade bottles or jars to be used.
- 4 Any items not according to schedule may be disqualified.
- 5 Cooked food may be covered with covers being removed by the stewards ready for judging.
- 6 Exhibit wording may be in either Welsh or English or any combination of the two.
- 7 Co-operative entries to be a combined effort of members in the WI entering. No more than 3 members will be allowed to stage at any one time.
- 8 Judges may penalise any entry if the base exceeds the measurements and if any items are staged outside the base.
- 9 The Cookery and Craft items must be removable for judging.
- 10 Sugar craft may be included as a cookery item provided all elements are edible otherwise the item will be Judged as Craft.
- 11 The committee cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to exhibits, although every reasonable care will be taken to avoid damage.
- 12 Judging is in accordance with the current NFWI book "On with the Show" and the Judges' decision is final. Complaints should be submitted in writing within 1 hour of the opening of the Rally.
